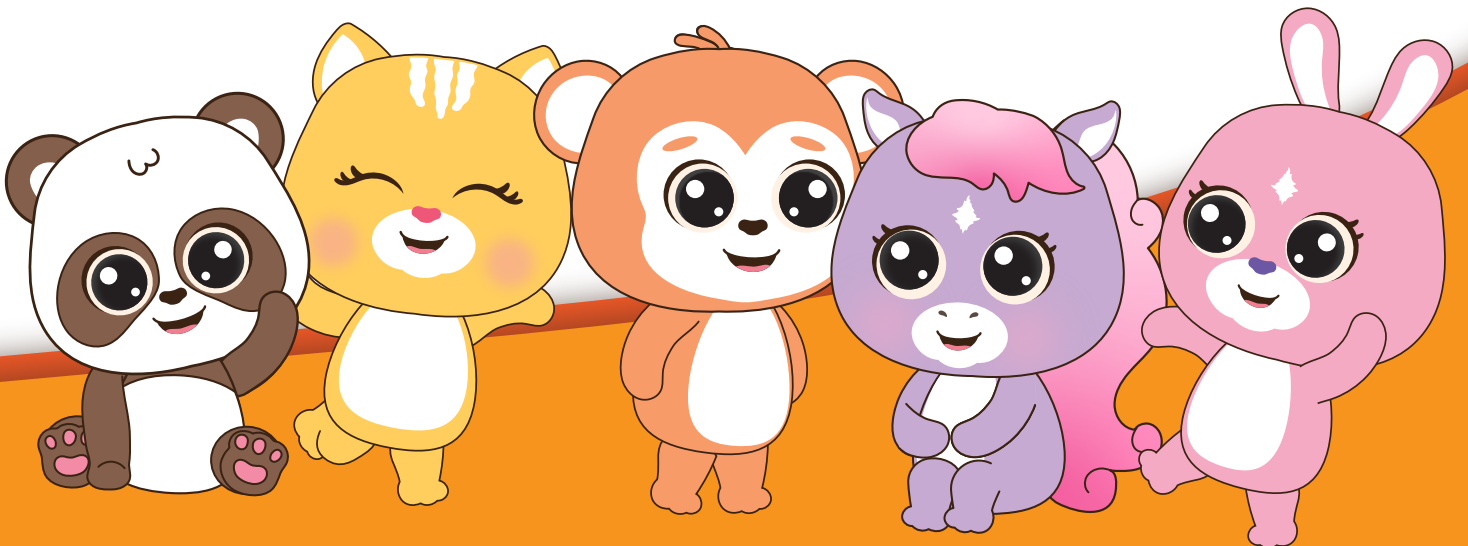

Importance of Social Emotional Learning

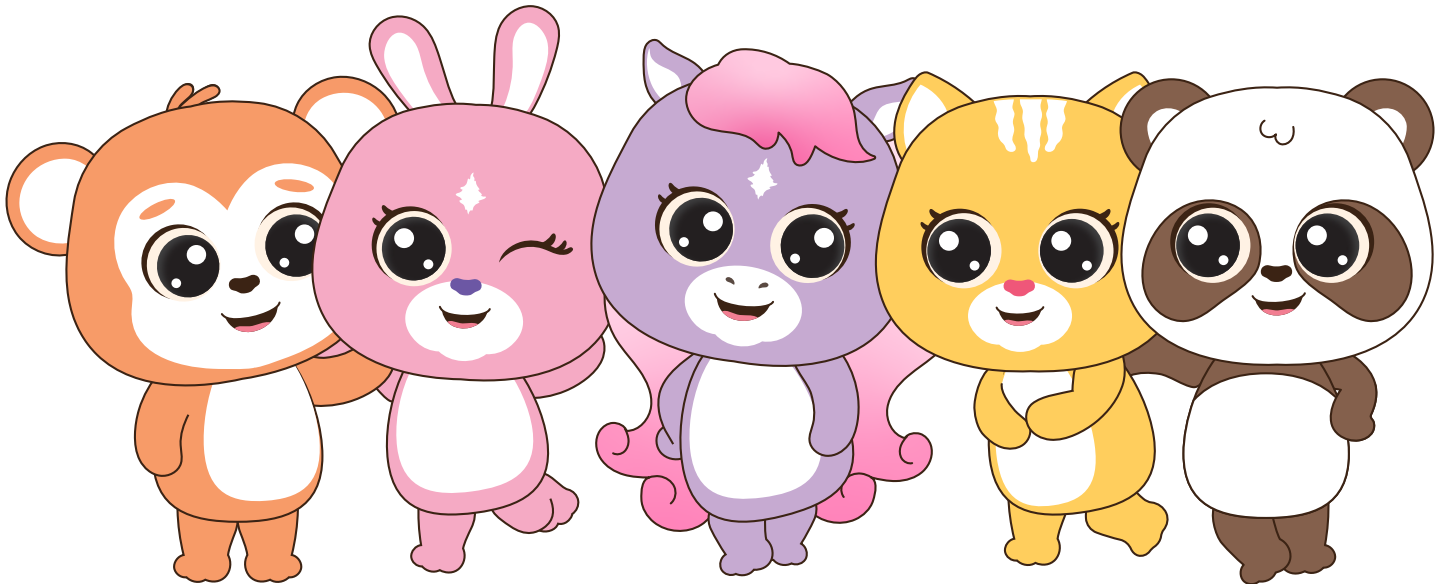

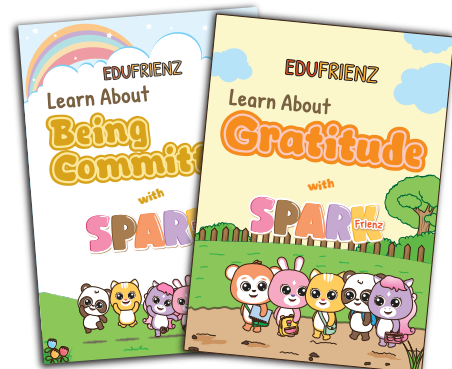

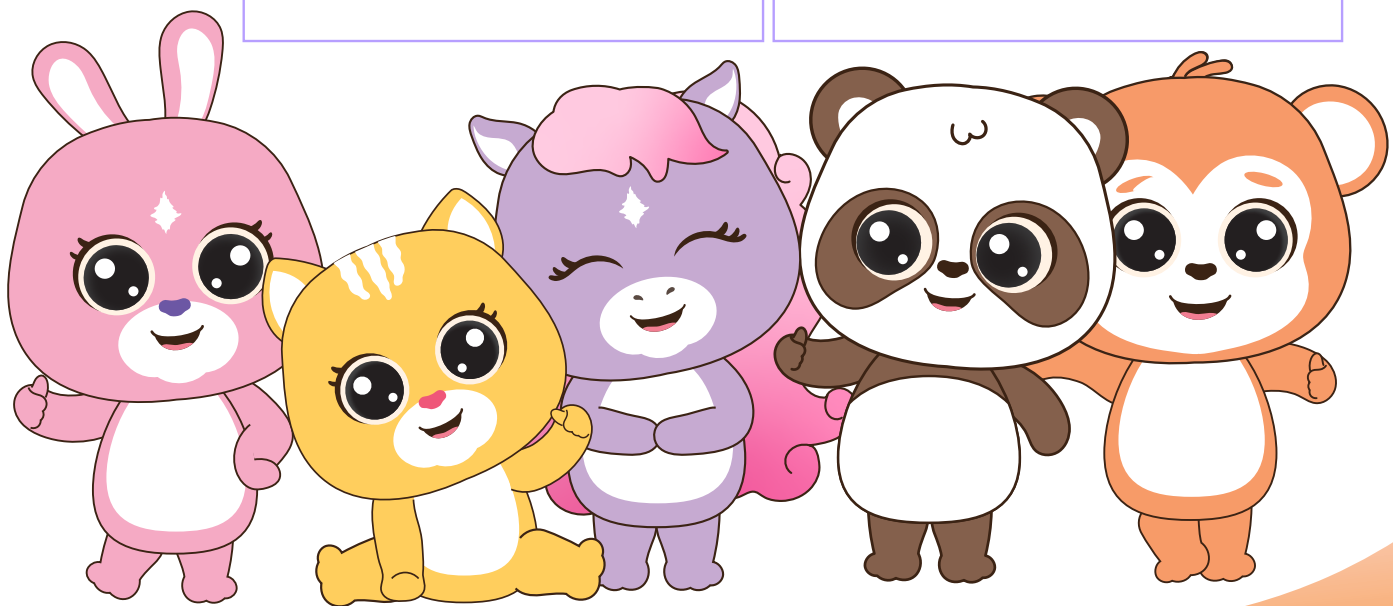
